## How the Program Works

You will earn community service hours through successfully fundraising for a charity or nonprofit organization of your choosing. The more individual donations you obtain, the more community service hours you will earn.

The chart below displays our system for awarding community service hours.

<b>Dollars Fundraised</b>	<b>Number of Individual Donors</b>	<b>Service Hours Earned</b>
<b>\$100</b> of Donations	Minimum of <b>5</b> different donors	<b>1</b> Community Service Hours
<b>\$500</b> of Donations	Minimum of <b>13</b> different donors	<b>5</b> Community Service Hours
<b>\$1,000</b> of Donations	Minimum of <b>17</b> different donors	<b>10</b> Community Service Hours
<b>\$1,500</b> of Donations	Minimum of <b>19</b> different donors	<b>15</b> Community Service Hours
<b>\$2,000</b> of Donations	Minimum of <b>20</b> different donors	<b>20</b> Community Service Hours
<b>\$4,000</b> of Donations	Minimum of <b>40</b> different donors	<b>40</b> Community Service Hours

The calculations for the donations-to-hours ratio above are based on our estimations of how long it takes a high school student to secure donations through fundraising efforts.

Once you have completed your fundraiser on behalf of your chosen charity or nonprofit organization, The AngeLink Community Foundation will award you your Community Service Hours by sending you the required certificate.

# How to Set up a Fundraiser

The AngeLink Community Foundation StudentLink program uses the free AngeLink crowdfunding platform to fundraise. AngeLink is the first crowdfunding platform built and powered by women and open to all. Students love using AngeLink because it's simple, fun and engaging—we're sure you'll like it too!

Once you have chosen the charity or nonprofit organization you'd like to support, you can begin fundraising. To set up a fundraiser, simply follow these five steps:

1. Visit AngeLink.com or download the AngeLink App
2. Create your profile and click 'Start a Fundraiser'
3. Set up your fundraiser with a title, photo, and description
4. Briefly explain this organization's mission and why this charity is important to you
5. Go live & invite friends and family to donate

It's super easy! Also, regarding step four, you can easily pull the information about the charity you've selected directly from their website (and a photo, too).

You'll earn virtual success rewards as you get closer to your goal.

# Fundraising Ideas

When it comes to fundraising ideas, the sky's the limit! In fact, our Social Innovation Scholarship is awarded to the student who makes the most creative fundraising effort. The important thing to remember when you're fundraising is that every donation must go through the AngeLink app or website. We are unable to accept cash donations.

## In-Person Fundraising

Inviting your community to rally around an important cause can be a lot of fun! Here are some of our favorite in-person fundraising ideas for high school students like you to conduct on or off campus.

On the AngeLink crowdfunding platform, your campaign will have a custom flyer with a unique QR code. If you host a fun in-person event (like the ones listed below) we'd highly recommend printing out your fundraiser's flyer, so donors can easily scan the QR code to donate!

Bake Sale: Who doesn't love cupcakes?

Pay to Enter Pick-up Basketball Game: All you need is a gym and a ball!

5k Run: Entry fee could be a \$5 donation.

Dance-a-thon or Swim-a-thon: Who will last the longest?

Selling snacks: Set up a stand at your school events.

Trivia night: Ask to use your school's cafeteria!

Holiday Candy-Grams: Halloween, Christmas or Valentines!

Whatever you plan, be sure that all donations are sent through the AngeLink crowdfunding platform so that you can receive full credit for every donation.

## Digital Fundraising

Social media is a powerful fundraising tool. Each fundraiser on AngeLink has its own custom link, which you can post across all social media platforms and send to friends and family. Here are the best ways to fundraise digitally and get others involved:

Instagram: Post the link to your fundraiser in your bio. Post Instagram stories to regularly ask for help and update others on your fundraiser's progress.

TikTok: Talk about why you're fundraising for this specific charity and how your friends' donations will help. And don't forget to put your fundraiser's link in your bio!

Facebook: Post about your fundraiser each week, asking your community to chip in. Don't forget to include the link! Also consider posting about your fundraiser in groups.

SnapChat: Take a screenshot and send from your camera to Snapchat, adding emojis and a short description. Add it to your story and send it to friends with the link to your fundraiser. Make sure when you post it to your story to include the link so that your friends can easily "swipe up" to donate.

Twitter: Tweet about your fundraiser, include the link, and add relevant hashtags so that others may find it!

Email: Email friends and family directly to ask them to donate. You may even consider asking your parents or guardians to forward your email along to their network of contacts.

Text: A simple text can go a long way! Write a brief message explaining your fundraiser and asking for donations to send out to others.

Be sure to obtain your parent's or guardian's permission before posting anything online!

## What is the StudentLink Program?

Our groundbreaking StudentLink leadership program is specifically designed to foster youth-led social innovation as well as practical and professional leadership skills to support nonprofit organizations. Students gain valuable advocacy skills through structured civic engagement and community service activities. StudentLink is empowering a new generation to be the change makers of tomorrow. And, there’s never been a better time.

## Who can apply to be a StudentLink participant?

We invite all high school students (13+) across the country to join our mission for social good, economic equality and gender parity. Our StudentLink program enables high school students to become tomorrow’s leaders, entrepreneurs and innovators.

## Why Join StudentLink?

StudentLink is a student-led philanthropic program focused on fundraising for underserved local charities and nonprofit organizations you care about. Our program provides an easy-to-use platform and a teen-friendly structure for high school students who want to team up with their friends and make a powerful difference in the world.

We know students are busy with homework, afterschool sports and other extracurricular activities. That’s why the StudentLink program is flexible and enables students to develop their skills in leadership, team building, collaboration, peer management and philanthropy virtually and on their own time. The best part is that you can invite friends to join you and have fun together while you do the most good. Now, that’s what we call a powerful impact!

## StudentLink FAQs (continued)

### Can I join as an individual or form a team?

Any student, aged 13 and up, can join StudentLink as an individual fundraiser for a cause that's important to you, or you can form a team with your friends to amplify your impact. The more friends you invite, the more fun you'll have together and more BUZZ you'll create to support your fundraiser. Now, that's a social impact you can feel good about!

### How does StudentLink work?

ACF supports exceptional high school students across the nation through our StudentLink program. Students within the StudentLink network select local charities to fundraise for, which allows our foundation to make a difference in countless communities nationwide. Each semester, we award three merit-based \$1,000 scholarships to outstanding college-bound students participating in our StudentLink program.

### What is the StudentLink Program Based on?

The model for StudentLink is based on leading research from Harvard, Stanford and Franklin Covey Leadership Institute. The program teaches students leadership, advocacy and civic engagement by having students fundraise for causes they're passionate about. Through the StudentLink Program, students learn practical and professional skills such as entrepreneurship, marketing and project management in raising funds to support local and national nonprofit organizations. We're empowering a new generation to be change makers of tomorrow.

### How do I get volunteer Community Service Hours?

As a StudentLink participant you will receive volunteer Community Service Hours ("CSH") hours from ACF as you raise funds to support a charity you believe in. As a StudentLink participant, you can not only fundraise virtually, but you're also able to participate in philanthropic volunteer activities, community building and/or marketing activities to support your fundraiser. The StudentLink program is designed to give you the flexibility to earn up to 40 Community Service Hours in the time frame that fits your schedule, which is seriously cool!

### How does ACF provide acknowledgement to my high school for the Community Service Hours that I earn through the StudentLink Program?

ACF will provide you with a formal StudentLink Community Service certificate for you to give to your high school Community/Volunteer Service Coordinator and/or College Counselor in order to obtain any approval or authorization that your high school may require. Please note that receipt of CSH may require approval from your high school.

### What platform does StudentLink use to fundraise?

StudentLink uses our technology partner's (AngeLink's) platform to conduct all fundraising activities to ensure participants are able to successfully and securely fundraise to support a charitable organization anywhere in the country.

### What are ways to promote my fundraiser?

After you join StudentLink, you can create a fundraiser to support a local nonprofit in your community or a national 501(c)(3) charity that you're passionate about. Share your fundraiser on your social media platforms (Instagram, Tik Tok, SnapChat, Facebook, Twitter, Pinterest, YouTube, etc). Post your fundraiser on your feed, stories, and direct message your friends encouraging them to donate to your fundraiser and to join the ACF community. Include ACF hashtags such as #AngelsAmongUs and #ArmyofAngels in your posts and messages to get more views for your fundraiser. Make sure to place hashtags where your friends, family and followers can see it—usually at the very beginning of your posts.

### Is the StudentLink Program inclusive?

StudentLink is a student-led program that is mission-driven. We strive to build an inclusive, diverse and accessible environment for all participants. We foster a culture of respect for all and believe that diversity, equity and inclusion are foundational to how we can come together to raise funds to support local communities and achieve the greatest good.

### How do I make sure that donations go directly to my fundraising campaign rather than the overall event?

When you form a team, make sure to share your personal fundraiser link so that donations go directly to your fundraising campaign. The easiest way to share your personal fundraising link is with the URL that's produced when you invite friends from your contact list on the AngeLink app.

### How can I thank donors who support my StudentLink fundraiser?

It's very important to thank donors who have supported your campaign. We always recommend that fundraiser organizers write a thank you note to everyone who donated to their campaign. These notes can be sent via text, email, or by mail. Gratitude is the best attitude!

### I received an offline donation. What should I do?

StudentLink is a digital donation network and we cannot accept offline donations. Please ask a parent or family member to convert the offline donation to an online donation by logging into AngeLink online or downloading the AngeLink app to complete a donation in lieu of any cash.

### Does StudentLink accept matching donations?

You can amplify your donation by asking your employer if your company has a matching gift program. Many organizations sponsor programs that match charitable contributions made by employees. # StudentLink Agreement and Policy

## AngeLink Community Foundation StudentLink Agreement and Policy (Must be 13+ Years Old)

In the AngeLink Community Foundation (“ACF”) StudentLink high school leadership development program, students learn practical and professional skills such as entrepreneurship, marketing and project management as they raise funds to support local and national nonprofit organizations. Through our StudentLink program, we’re empowering a new generation to be the change-makers of tomorrow. There’s never been a better time. Join us!

By joining StudentLink, I understand and agree that:

1. I will truthfully promote ACF and what it stands for. As a participant in StudentLink, I share ACF’s mission to promote social good, economic equality and gender parity through charitable fundraising initiatives, advocacy, and structured civic engagement programs. I pledge to do my part to help build a positive, inclusive and diverse community to create a powerful positive impact.
2. I agree to represent and promote ACF and the StudentLink program in a truthful and ethical manner that promotes these core values at all times.
3. I will follow the directions given to me and complete the required tasks asked of me by ACF to the best of my ability. I will respect my StudentLink peers and team members and work professionally with them. I will not post or disclose any false, misleading or confidential information. I will present ACF in a sincere and truthful manner and will conduct myself under this Agreement in a manner that reflects the highest standards of responsibility and integrity in preserving ACF’s reputation.
4. I will protect ACF’s trademarks and trade names by not reproducing ACF’s name and/or trademarks or copy any of ACF’s materials for use without the prior written approval of ACF.
5. I understand that I am not an employee, agent, partner or franchisee of, or joint venturer of ACF. I understand that I cannot act on behalf of, represent or execute any contracts on behalf of ACF nor do I have any authority to incur any debt, obligation or liability on ACF’s behalf.
6. I have carefully read and agreed to comply with StudentLink policy and procedures, all of which are incorporated into and made a part of this StudentLink Agreement and StudentLink Policy, (collectively referred to as the “Agreement”). I understand that I must be in good standing, and not in violation of any of the terms of this Agreement as a StudentLink participant for ACF. I understand that ACF may amend this Agreement at its sole discretion upon written notice (including via email). Amendments shall be effective as of the date I receive such written notice. If I do not agree to any amendment, I shall cease to serve as a StudentLink participant by notifying ACF in writing (including via email) no later than 30 days after I received such notice from ACF.
7. I understand that my term as a StudentLink participant for ACF will last for so long as specified by ACF and at ACF’s discretion, may last approximately 4 months, such as a semester (September-December or February-May) or it may be longer depending on my activity and engagement in the StudentLink program. I also understand that if I choose to become a StudentLink participant in a future semester or time period, I may have to reapply for this position. I understand that even if I were a StudentLink participant previously, I am not guaranteed a StudentLink membership when I reapply.

## StudentLink Agreement and Policy (continued)

8. I understand that as a StudentLink participant, that my activities are completed as a volunteer help to raise funds or participate in philanthropic volunteer activities to support a local nonprofit organization or an IRS registered 501(c)(3) charity and I will not be paid any cash compensation. I will not be treated as an employee of ACF with respect to this Agreement for federal, state or local law tax purposes, or otherwise. I also agree to abide by any federal, state and local laws relating to me being a StudentLink participant.
9. I understand that information and materials provided to me relating to the StudentLink program may contain non-public information about ACF. I will not disclose these materials to any third parties without ACF's prior written consent except as required by law.
10. If ACF discovers that any of my posts on social media channels, or other websites or otherwise does not comply with the terms as set forth herein or may be objectionable to ACF for any reason, ACF reserves the right to remove or require that I remove such posts from my social media accounts or anywhere I may have reposted this content as ACF deems appropriate in its sole discretion.
11. I understand that I may receive volunteer Community Service Hours (CSH), merchandise, and/or other potential forms of compensation such as prizes or awards in exchange for my StudentLink activities. As a StudentLink participant, I agree to abide by this Agreement, including following instructions from ACF relating to posting, reposting, and sharing StudentLink and/or ACF content or generating my own content on behalf of StudentLink and/or ACF on social media.
12. ACF may occasionally provide promotional material and/or merchandise to aid in hosting virtual or live fundraising events, marketing programs and community building activities. I understand that if I am provided with any such items, I will only use them for ACF's intended purpose.
13. I understand that as a StudentLink participant I may post and promote my own user-generated content as well as StudentLink and/or ACF content as outlined above. I agree to act in a truthful and ethical manner as a StudentLink participant at all times. I understand that ACF may repost any of my social media posts that include StudentLink and/or ACF both during and after my term as a StudentLink participant.

## Volunteer Community Service Hours and College Scholarship Awards:

1. I understand that I may be eligible to receive volunteer Community Service (CSH) hours upon completion of fundraising tasks to support a nonprofit organization as well as philanthropic volunteer hours, community building and/or marketing activities on social media to support ACF's mission to promote economic equality and gender parity. I understand that through fundraising initiatives, advocacy, and structured civic engagement programs, I can help build a positive, inclusive, and diverse community to create a powerful positive impact and social good.
2. I understand that my receipt of CSH may require approval from the high school I currently attend. ACF will provide me with a formal CSH acknowledgement to provide to my high school Community/Volunteer Service Coordinator and/or College Counselor in order to obtain any approval or authorization that my high school may require.
3. I understand that exceptional StudentLink participants who are making an outstanding contribution in their community may be eligible to receive a \$1,000 college scholarship for the following scholarships: Social Impact Award, Social Engagement Award, and Social Innovation Award.

## StudentLink Agreement and Policy (continued)

4. I further understand that ACF awards StudentLink scholarships based solely on my own individual participation and personal success in fundraising activities, community building programs and philanthropic volunteer service hours as well as my own participation in social impact innovation projects. I also understand that by my participation in the StudentLink program, I am not guaranteed to win an award or a \$1,000 scholarship for college.

### General:

1. I may terminate this Agreement upon 30 days' written notice to ACF. ACF may terminate this Agreement, for any reason or for no reason, immediately upon written notice to me.
2. This Agreement cannot be altered, modified or changed other than in writing signed by an authorized ACF representative.
3. This Agreement shall be governed by the internal laws of the State of Delaware.
4. ACF may discontinue the StudentLink program at any time with or without written notice.
5. I recognize that failure to abide by the rules and principles of ACF and/or breach of this Agreement by me may result in removal of my position as a StudentLink participant.
6. I represent that, in agreeing to this Agreement that I am 13+ years of age or older.

By joining StudentLink, I acknowledge that I agree to ACF's Code of Ethics & Conduct Policy.
